

<p><u>Maths</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have a deep understanding of numbers to 10. • Verbally count beyond 20, recognising the number patterns in the counting system • Writing numbers to 20 • Automatically recall number bonds to 5 • Perform and write addition & subtraction calculations • Compare quantities using greater than/ less than vocabulary • Explore patterns including odds & evens 	<p><u>Big Question -</u> <i>What makes our world beautiful?</i></p> 	<p><u>Literacy (See book list)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Simple sentences when retelling stories • Phonics - encouraging use of any sounds we hear. • Sequencing stories • Using conjunctions (and so but because) to extend sentences • Learning to read common exception words • Demonstrate understanding of what has been read • Read aloud simple sentences consistent with their phonics knowledge • Know some letters of the alphabet as well as its sound
